

# ORNAMENTAL CABBAGE AND KALE

Add a splash of color to your fall and early winter landscape with ornamental Cabbage and Kale!

Plant them in combination with mums, pansies or ornamental grasses. Or, feature Cabbage and Kale by themselves in mass plantings, as an edging or in containers.

The blue-green leaves of ornamental Cabbage and Kale open from the center to reveal white, pink, red and purple colors. These colors will intensify as the weather becomes cooler. Kale has frilled leaves and Cabbage has smooth leaves. They are edible, but are best used to line salad

bowls or garnish vegetable platters.

Ornamental Cabbage and Kale grow best in full sun and moist, well-drained soil. First, prepare the area to be planted, using

compost or humus and use a root stimulator at the time of planting to promote new root development.

Always plant your Cabbage and Kale deep so the rosette of leaves is at ground level — new roots will develop along the stem and the plant will remain compact.

During periods of dry weather, water weekly with a slowly trickling hose for five minutes.
