Dracaena Warnekii Plant

Dracaena Warnekii, like all Dracaenas, are hardy, slow-growing houseplants that thrive on neglect. Sometimes referred to as the Striped Dracaena, this dracaena has long, pointed, narrow green and white striped leaves. They can be used as table plants, bushy floor plants, or tall cane plants for home or office. They have wider leaves and are more compact plant. It is one of the few colorful plants that can survive in low light conditions. NASA recommends Dracaena Warnekii as one of the top ten plants for removing formaldehyde from the air.

Light: It survives in low light, but grows faster and fuller in medium light. In low light the new leavers may be smaller and narrower. Direct sun burns the leaves of a Striped Dracaena.

Water: All Dracaenas like to be kept on the dry side. Water well and then allow the top 50% of the soil to dry out before watering again. Dark brown leaf tips are a sign of over-watering or extreme under-watering. The lower the light level the less water a Dracaena Warnekii needs. All Dracaenas are very sensitive to fluoride, so never use fluoridated water.



Fertilizing: Dracaena plants do not require much fertilizer. Feed a Dracaena Warnekii with a good indoor plant food monthly in spring and summer at ½ the recommended strength. It's not necessary to feed Dracaenas in the fall or winter
